DIRECTIONS TO SHOW: I-40 TO EXIT 123, NORTH ON SOUTH COUNTRY CLUB RD. TURN LEFT ONTO WEST SUNSET DR/OK 66, TURN RIGHT ONTO NORTH COUNTRY CLUB RD.

Llamas may begin arriving after 5 p.m. on Friday, May 1st, and must be in place no later than 9 a.m. May 2nd 2009. Stalls are available for overnight at no charge. You will be responsible for removal of all stalling materials at the end of the show.

The Judge's meeting will be held at 9:30 a.m. and the show will start at 10. You are released when you finish showing.

PARTICIPANTS IN THE JUDGING CLASSES SHOULD ARRIVE NO LATER THAN 5 P.M. ON FRIDAY MAY 1ST. PART OF THE JUDGING WILL TAKE PLACE ON FRIDAY AND THE REMAINDER WILL BEGIN AT 8:00 SHARP ON SATURDAY.

This llama show is an ALSA approved show sponsored by the Oklahoma Llama Association. All entries must be made prior to the closing date of April 11th 2009. A single entry fee of \$40 will allow each youth to enter all classes that they qualify for age wise. In addition to the entry fee, a \$5 per animal fee will be assessed by ALSA. All class changes, additions, and substitutions must be made no later than April 18TH 2009.

All Youth age 8 and over must be ALSA members to participate in this show, or a \$15.00 non-member fee will be charged. A copy of your ALSA card must accompany your entry. Not required for sub-juniors. For information about ALSA membership go to the ALSA website at www.alsashow.org.

LIVESTOCK HEALTH REGULATIONS: All llamas must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued within 30 days of the arrival at the Heartland Youth Llama Show, and must be free from external parasites, ringworm and warts.

QUALIFICATION FOR ENTRY IN ALSA YOUTH CLASSES: All youth between the ages 8-18 as of January 1, 2009 may show in ALSA approved YOUTH CLASSES. Anyone who turns 8 before May 2nd will be allowed to show in the Junior Class. (The Sub-Junior division under 8 years does not receive ALSA points). Points go to the youth not the llamas. Youth must have written permission from parent, project leader, 4-H advisor or FFA advisor to participate in the youth

events.

To qualify for the Performance Grand or Reserve awards, the youth must enter and compete in Youth Obstacle, Youth Public Relations and Youth Pack. The same animal must be used for all three classes. The animal must be at least 5 months old.
