RULES

This is a two-day show. Performance classes, Non-Breeder classes, and Mini-Llama classes will be held on Saturday. Showmanship and Halter classes will be held on Sunday.

- This show is approved by the Alpaca and Llama Show Association, Inc. All rules and guidelines for the shows will be in accordance with the current edition of the ALSA Handbook (Edition 14).
- All llamas entered in approved classes, with the exception of Youth classes, Non-Breeders, and Performance classes, **must be** registered or have passed screening with the International Llama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). If Non-Breeders are not registered and wish to be in the ALSA award system and wish to show in halter, they must show in the adult Non-Breeder halter class.
- Registration papers or photocopies must be sent with the entry form to show management for verification of name and age. Failure to meet this requirement prohibits entry in the show.
- Non-Breeder llamas must be accompanied by a registration or veterinarian certificate verifying the animal is a gelding, a vasectomized male, or a spayed or non-reproductive female.
- Exhibitors must be the registered owners and make entry in the exact names (owner and animal) as shown on the registration certificate.
- Nursing llama mothers may not be accompanied in the ring by their babies. ALSA recommends not showing nursing mothers.
- Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's decision.
- Non-ALSA members must pay a \$30.00 fee per farm for showing their animals in ALSA llama and alpaca shows.
- Youth may exhibit only one entry **per** youth class.
- Youth may compete in Open Performance and Youth Performance, however, they must use a different llama. Open Performance will be held first.
- A llama may only be used in **one** performance division.
- Non-ALSA fee for youth is \$15.00. Youth showing as handlers in open classes do not pay Non-Member fee. **This fee is for Non-Member youth showing in Youth classes.**
- Animals entered in **Get and Produce** classes may be decided after halter classes. However, they must be listed with show clerk **before** this class is held.
- To qualify for Youth Performance Champion, the youth must show in Obstacle, Public Relations and Pack. They must use the same animal for all three classes unless the animal is less than 18 months old. In that case only, the youth may use a second animal for the Youth pack class.
- Minimum age for a handler in any class is **eight** years old. It is recommended that exhibitors 8 – 12 years of age not show intact males over the age of 24 months.
- Alpacas may compete in the llama performance classes; however, we are not offering alpaca halter classes.
- **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:** The State of Iowa does require health papers. All animals must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 days.

SHOW TIME: 9:00 a.m. each day *****BE PROMPT***** *Once the class has entered the ring and the gate is closed, late exhibitors may not enter a class.*

EXHIBITOR MEETING: 8:30 a.m. each day (in arena)

ENTRY DEADLINE: April 4, 2008 postmarked

FEES:

CLASS FEE: \$10.00 per class

SUB-JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP: \$5.00 (Non-ALSA)

ALSA FEE: \$5.00 per animal

LATE ENTRY FEE: \$25.00 per animal

LATE ENTRY DEADLINE: April 11, 2008

NON MEMBER FEES: \$30.00 per farm; \$15.00 per youth

ENTRY CHANGES: \$10.00 for each entry change after arrival at the show (includes adding a class, changing a class, animal substitution).

STALL FEES: \$25.00 per stall if you supply your own panels; \$30.00 per stall if we supply the panels. Most of the permanent stalls are a minimum of 9' x 9' wooden box stalls with clay floors. No more than 2 animals per stall, unless they are under one year old. Exhibitors provide their own feed and bedding (*please no straw bedding*). If you are sharing stalls with someone, please indicate this on your entry form. Stalls will be assigned on a first come-first served basis. Community tack stalls will be assigned. Small displays can be set up in the aisles only. There are wash areas. Every barn has electricity and water nearby. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to keep their area clean at all times. **Please clean your area before you depart.**

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded through sixth place and for Grand and Reserve Champions.

ARRIVAL: After 12:00 noon on Friday, April 25, 2008.

RELEASE: Llamas may leave any time after they have completed showing.

VENDING SPACE: Vendors may rent a space (approximately 10' x 10') for \$15.00 (you bring tables).
