All SCLA rules and guidelines will apply to the SCLA Youth Championship Show

GENERAL RULES: Read the General Rules in the front of the premium list for health requirements, arrival/departure times, stalls, passes, etc.

SCHOLARSHIPS: A \$10,000 and \$6,000 scholarship will be awarded in the Senior (15-18) Youth Division. Points for the scholarships will be computed on a "*one llama, one handler basis*". See General Rules for Scholarship Eligibility and Requirements.

ENTRIES: Enter online at www.sarodeo.com. Entry forms, ILR registration papers, copy of current ALSA membership card and \$30 payment (\$25 Entry Fee and \$5 ALSA Fee per animal). Entries not checked in at the Horse Arrival Station by 8:00 a.m. on the first day of your classes will be presumed to have scratched. All SCLA Youth Championship entries are by qualification only.

ENTRY DEADLINES: Entries must be postmarked by January 10th. Entries after this date will be accepted online only. The last date to enter online **without a late fee** is January 20th. The last date to enter is February 10th and a \$10 late fee per animal will apply. There will be no additional class fees. Entries cannot be changed after February 10th.

CLASS CHANGES: Forms for request for class changes will be available at the show. Class changes due to wool classification changes must be initiated by the judge(s). All other changes are at the discretion of show management. All changes shall be presented to the Show Superintendent.

STALLS: A stall is mandatory for every llama entering the grounds. Llama stalls are \$45 and tack stalls are \$55. **All stalls must be purchased in advance with entries.** Stalls will not be preassigned. No more than two llamas in a stall without show management approval. Heat lamps are prohibited in all barns. The Fire Marshall will not allow straw or paper bedding due to fire hazards.

PREMIUMS: Premiums will be paid for all Halter, Youth and Open Performance Classes, except Dam & Cria and Costume, but does not include any other S.A.L.E. or SCLA Youth Classes. Premiums will be awarded as follows:

Halter and Open Performance:	1 st -\$30	2 nd -\$25	3 rd -\$20	4 th -\$15

AWARDS: Banners will be awarded to Grand and Reserve Champions, except youth. Best of Show (Halter Grand Champions compete) will receive an award. Rosettes will be awarded to Youth Grand and Reserve Champions. Ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 5th. All SCLA class awards are determined and distributed by SCLA.

JR. EXHIBITOR: Age computed by Jr. Exhibitor's age on January 1st. Youth eight and under are not eligible to show adult intact males two years or older.

HALTER CLASSES: Llamas cannot be moved from one class to another after January 20th, except at the direction of the judge with regard to wool classification. Classes may be combined due to lack of entries.

DIVISIONS:

Suri Wool: Distinctive, well-defined narrow lock structure, which is indicated by the many individual separate locks of fiber formed at the skin and carried out to the ends of each lock. (See part I, section 1, paragraph A of ALSA Handbook.)

Light Wool: Minimal body wool, short neck wool, and smooth legs.

Medium Wool: Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate head and leg wool.

Heavy Wool: Abundant body and neck, with minimal to abundant leg wool (i.e., leg wool at least to knee and hock).

Age Divisions: No llama under 5 months may be shown in an ALSA approved halter class, Get of Sire, or Produce of Dam. Animal's age is computed by its age on the first day of this show.

Juvenile:	5 - 12 months
Yearling:	13 - 24 months
Two Year Old:	25 - 36 months
Adult:	37 months and older

ALSA & ILR: All llamas must be registered with the ILR except for llamas entered in Youth or Non Breeders Classes. (Juveniles must now show ILR numbers) All adult non-members must pay a \$30 ALSA Non Member Fee and youth non-member handlers must pay a \$15 ALSA Non Member Fee to show in youth classes. Youth showing as handler in open classes do not have to pay Non Member Fee.

ALSA numbers must be submitted with entry form to acquire ALSA points. You will not receive your back number unless the Show Superintendent receives a copy of your current ALSA membership cards and I.L.R. papers. **Current ALSA membership and registration numbers must be provided on entry form and copies of registration certificates must be submitted or you will be charged the ALSA nonmember fee in order to receive your back number.**

Get of Sire: Three or more offspring of either sex by the same Sire. The Get must represent offspring by at least two different dams. All Get must first be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. Sire will not be shown in this class. Points won will go to the Sire. Entrants must be designated by 8:00 a.m. on the day of the class with clerk of course.

Produce of Dam: Two or more offspring of either sex by the same Dam. All Produce must first be shown in their appropriate halter class age division. The Dam will not be shown in this class. Points won will go to Dam. Entrants must be designated by 8:00 a.m. on the day of the class with clerk of course.

Dam & Cria: For cria (baby llamas) between 3 and 5 months of age. Cria must be accompanied by their dams in the show ring. This is not an ALSA points class.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES: Llamas cannot be moved from one class to another after January 20th. Llamas may be entered in only one of the divisions offered for each class.

OBSTACLE COURSES: Llamas may show in only one performance division (youth performance, novice or open performance). There is a \$5 per animal ALSA Show Recording Fee for all animals entered, including animals that youth use and Get and Produce (not for the 2 or 3 being shown, but for sire or dam). **Novice** – Open to all entries that have won fewer than three (3) ribbons for first, second or third in Open, Advanced division of the respective ALSA Approved Class. **Advanced** – Open to all entries who have previously placed first, second or third in the Open, Advanced or Novice division of the respective ALSA approved classes. No llama may be entered in more than one obstacle class, nor entered in any obstacle class more than once. Exhibitor will be allowed only 2 misses or balks and then will be automatically disqualified and asked to leave the ring. This rule does not apply to S.A.L.E. Youth Classes. SCLA rules will apply to SCLA Youth Classes.

ADULT SHOWMANSHIP: Adult Showmanship qualifies as a point class for adult exhibitors who are registered and competing for ALSA Adult Showmanship Champion status.

NOVICE PACK LLAMA: For llamas 5 through 36 months. The exhibitor must provide their own saddle and panniers, training pack with two cinches, complete with fill material. (see ALSA Handbook for complete rules and regulations).

ADVANCED PACK LLAMA: For llamas 36 months and older. Llama must carry at least 40 lbs. in the panniers. The exhibitor must provide a saddle and panniers suitable for back country use. Complete with weight requirements. (see ALSA Handbook for complete rules and regulations).

OPEN PERFORMANCE GRAND/RESERVE CHAMPION: All llamas meeting the following requirements will compete for this award. Llamas must be entered in a minimum of two approved performance classes, one of which must be Advanced Obstacle. Approved performance classes are Novice and Advanced Public Relations, Novice and Advanced Pack and Novice and Advanced Obstacle. Points will be awarded according to the ALSA point chart. The llama placing highest in the Advanced Obstacle class will break ties. Exhibitors are responsible for maintaining their exhibitor numbers for the entire show. Mismatched numbers can disqualify an exhibitor.

SCLA YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES: SCLA Youth Championship entries qualify in regional shows pursuant to SCLA Rules. Registration for SCLA Youth Championship Classes is via SCLA, not S.A.L.E. Animals shown in the SCLA Youth Championship may also be entered in the appropriate S.A.L.E. Youth Show.

S.A.L.E. YOUTH SHOW: **No trophies will be awarded to youth.** Classes are designed to teach and reward youth for working with their animals. Any llama entered in an open, advanced, or novice class will not be eligible for Senior or Reserve High Point Youth. Youth must be an ALSA member or pay the \$15 ALSA Nonmember Fee to show in Youth classes. Junior 8-11, Intermediate 12-14, and Senior 15-18 may be combined in any combination if there are not 8 in a youth division. Youth who turn 19 after January 1st, but before the Grand National of their final showing year, may compete the year as a Youth in the Senior division. Llamas showing in Youth Division may NOT show in Open or Novice Division.

YOUTH GRAND/RESERVE CHAMPION: All youths who meet the following requirements will compete for this award. Youths must be entered in all Judging Classes for their age group, and a minimum of two of the three remaining youth classes of Showmanship, Youth Obstacle, and Youth Public Relations. Points will be awarded according to ALSA Youth Point Chart. Ties will be broken by youth placing highest in the Judging Reasons for youth 15-18, and Judging Questions by youth 14 & under. Each youth must show the same animal in each of these classes to qualify for this award. Youth Grand/Reserve Champion will not receive trophies.
