

VERMILLION COUNTY FAIR ALSA LEVEL I SHOW
Cayuga, Indiana

We are proud to present for the second year an ALSA Sanctioned Level I Llama Show to be held at the Vermillion County Fairgrounds, Cayuga, Indiana, on Saturday evening, June 20, 2009. The show will be held immediately following the 4-H Llama show at approximately 5:00 p.m. Indiana time. Doug Overman of Otterbein, Indiana, has agreed to be our judge. The current edition of the ALSA Handbook will be followed.

The show will consist of halter, showmanship, produce of dam, and get of sire. We will have four wool classes if there are enough entries in the wool division. Since payment must be sent with all entries, faxed entry forms cannot be accepted.

Arrival: Saturday, June 20th, 2009

Release: Upon completion of showing and no later than 2 hours after the last class judged.

Fees: \$25 per animal includes the \$5.00 ALSA fee and the first class.
\$10 per animal for each additional class
There are no stalls or pens provided. Bring your own pens if a pen is desired. Be prepared to tie up off your trailer. There should be ample shade available

There is an additional \$30 fee for exhibitors who are not members of ALSA. This is **PER FARM**, not per entry.

Food and drinks will be available to purchase during the show hours.

This fairground is considered primitive. However, there are both men and women's bathrooms and showers available. Electric service will be provided.

Exhibitors' Meeting: For your convenience, there will be an exhibitors meeting Saturday evening prior to starting the show for the purpose of updating information for the show. ***It is very important that you attend this meeting to ensure that you know what is happening!***

Trophies: Rosettes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each wool division. Ribbons will be awarded through 4th place.

All required entry fees, copies of ILR registration certificates, and copies of ALSA membership cards must accompany the entry form. New this year is the premise ID number assigned by each state. Please be sure to provide the number in the location on the form. Failure to provide this information prohibits entry into the show. Exhibitors are not required to be members of ALSA to participate, but, as noted above, non-ALSA members must pay a \$30 per farm fee per show. Entries for non-breeders must have that indicated on their registration papers or have an accompanying veterinarian certificate.

Health papers are required. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Only your vet can obtain the permit. Please contact your veterinarian for more details. There may be a visit by the Indiana State Veterinarian, so we must be sure everything is totally in order.

All rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the most current ALSA Handbook. The most current ALSA handbook will be available for viewing and rule verification at the check-in table.

The only class changes that will be permitted after an exhibitor's arrival at the show will be if there are an insufficient number of entries in a classification. Then classes may be combined if exhibitors are in agreement with such change. Once llamas are at the show, only a judge may move an animal to a different wool division. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter his/her animal(s) in the proper class(es). **Animals registered in the wrong class may not be shown in that class.** Any corrections in wool class placement must be done before judging of the show starts. No substitutes will be allowed from the original entry form unless an animal becomes ill and permission is granted by the Show Superintendent or Clerk ***prior*** to the show. Any substitute animal will show in the classes entered for the original animal. *Money will **NOT** be refunded if an animal is withdrawn from the show.*

There are four wool divisions:

1. Suri: fleece with a luster and hand that drapes over the llama's body, usually forming a natural part along the spine. Fibers are grouped into a very distinctive and well-defined narrow lock structure.
2. Light: minimal body wool, short neck wool, with smooth legs
3. Medium: moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool
4. Heavy: abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool

There are no wool divisions for non-breeder llama halter classes.

Exhibitors must provide their own feed, hay, and bedding.

There is an unheated wash rack available. Also, electricity is available for grooming/cooling. Water is available at strategic locations.

We expect exhibitors to be prompt for each class. Once the class has entered the ring and the judge and gateman have agreed this is the class, late exhibitors may not enter. Exhibitors/animals will enter in numerical order. Bucking the order could result in being excused from the show. The Superintendent will excuse any exhibitor who shows poor sportsmanship, especially toward the judges, the ring steward, the gate keepers, or the runners.

This show is limited to 130 animals! Get your entries in!
